



LAUNCHPAD FOR LITERACY

INFORMATION:

The Early Years Foundation Stage Consultancy Team are delighted to be working with Delta's Education Exchange and Launchpad for Literacy in order to offer all primary schools in Barnsley the opportunity to join our 'Launchpad for Literacy' project. The project is aimed at EYFS and will complement the implementation of the revised EYFS framework focusing on language development. Launchpad is a supportive tool for staff in terms of identifying and responding to need, for all children in particularly disadvantaged pupils and those with communication and language needs.

Launchpad for Literacy is a systematic, skill-based approach, enabling you to;

- Identify speech, language and other developmental needs as soon as possible and to embed specific skill-based intervention into practice and 'Quality First Teaching.' have a greater level of diagnostic capability, establishing reasons and solutions to close the skills gap for individual children.
- The project is aimed at improving Communication and language across the borough by upskilling practitioners. We are really excited about this project as communication and language is highlighted as an area where attainment is low for our youngest children in Barnsley.
- Funding has meant that we have been able to offer Launchpad for literacy to all schools in Barnsley who can use the education exchange to support their use of it and provide useful CPD for them.. We have had 48 schools apply for the first cohort. Schools who haven't applied in the first cohort will be invited to be part of the second cohort later in the Autumn term. The project will also be rolled out to settings later on this academic year.

All schools offering statutory induction are required to have an appropriate body for their early career teachers (ECTs)

- Register ECTs with the Teacher Regulation Agency (TRA).

 Provide access to ECT Manager, our electronic system which reduces administration for schools and ECTs.
- Offer welcome events for ECTs to share vital information around processes, roles and

 Provide training and telephone support for mentors, induction futors and headteachers, including schools who may have concerns over the progress of their ECTs.

 A personalised service with a named point of contact for your ECTs and mentors.
- Ensure ECTs are fairly and regularly assessed through the sampling and monitoring of progress reviews and formal assessments at the end of year 1 and 2.

 Facilitate additional support for ECTs not meeting Teacher/Induction Standards, drawing
