We are proud to say that our offer has once again been co-constructed through consultation with the CPD/Networking Working Party.


Our offer is research informed, drawing upon the latest guidance from the Education Endowment Foundation (EEF) and all opportunities are aligned to the DFE's CPD standards.

# ENGAGING WITH EVIDENCE - A SERIES OF LEADERSHIP WORKSHOPS UNPICKING THE EEF GUIDANCE REPORTS

Session 1 will unpick the evidence report content and set a gap task. This will be followed by Session 2 which will support schools to implement the guidance into their individual setting. 

# BARNSLEY EAL CHAMPION PROGRAMME

## **OVERVIEW:**

The EAL Champion programme is a nationally recognised intensive programme of professional development for teachers/leaders on EAL practice and pedagogy with school based action research and mentoring. It consists of 5 half-day training sessions and two mentoring sessions enabling the Champion to acquire specialist knowledge and skills to fulfil their role in school. Participants undertake a small scale action research project focussing on an area relevant to the school / setting. There is mentoring and support from consultants to undertake this project.

#### This programme will support EAL Champions to:

- Develop their own expertise to improve and enhance current EAL provision in school
- · Develop learning and teaching through a greater understanding of EAL pedagogy and practice
- Implement nationally and locally recognised EAL strategy and effective practice within their school
- Provide an additional level of identified support within their own school
- Raise attainment of EAL learners by promoting the use of materials / resources by modelling good practice and promoting the use of relevant materials and resources
- Support their colleagues in school through modelling and coaching in school to plan, assess, set targets, and provide effective learning and teaching to raise the attainment of EAL learners
- Provide input and support for Champions to deliver school based INSET training
- Provide advice and support to colleagues in school on scaffolding the linguistic and academic development of EAL learners
- Network with other teachers and leaders to exchange ideas and share practice to enhance the learning for pupils and staff

#### Geography

Vicki Poutney - Senior Lecturer in Education at Sheffield Hallam - PGCE Geography Subject Leader, Teach First Geography Subject Lead (Yorkshire and Humber region) FRGS CGeog (Teach).

#### History

Andy Bull - Senior Lecturer in Secondary Education at Sheffield Hallam - Academic tutor for PGCE History trainees following Core PGCE or School Direct PGCE routes.

#### Science

Joelle Halliday - Senior Research Fellow at Sheffield Hallam University and has significant expertise in leading teacher professional development, with a specific focus on Primary Science.

#### They will also be supported by:

Diane Heritage, Education Consultant. Formerly Lead Associate for the National College for School Leadership. Diane specialises in coaching, professional learning, policy development and school improvement. She was a Senior Associate with the Education Endowment Foundation working with a range of partners to bring the use of evidence-based practice closer to schools.

Subject Champions will plan and deliver evidenced based to termly subject network meetings. Schools will have a choice of two dates and locations per term for each of the subjects to ensure the networks are as accessible as possible.

# HOW TEACHING ASSISTANTS CAN SUPPORT SEND PUPILS IN THE MAINSTREAM CLASSROOM

## **OVERVIEW:**

The programme will focus on exploring the evidence underpinning the recommendations within the EEF guidance report 'Supporting SEND pupils in the mainstream classroom' with a particular focus on the 5 High Quality teaching strategies:

- Explicit instruction
- Metacognition
- · Scaffolding
- Flexible grouping
- The use of technology

Teaching Assistants will be supported to develop a repertoire of these strategies that can be used flexibly in response to individual needs.

The programme design will include opportunities to build knowledge, motivate, develop techniques and embed practice, incorporating a range of EEF design mechanisms.

### Specific programme modules will support schools to:

- Create a positive and supportive environment for all pupils, without exception
- · Build an ongoing, holistic understanding of pupils and their needs
- Ensure all pupils have access to high quality support
- Complement high quality teaching with carefully selected small-group and one-to-one interventions
- · Work effectively with teaching

Each programme delivery day will involve a 'theory into practice' session using practical examples, and case studies to exemplify the evidence.




The ECF has been designed to support early career teacher development in five core areas:




